Course Overview

- **Why choose this course?**

Peter Sefton's Wood Machining Course provides an introduction to wood machines and can also be useful for woodworkers who need to be updated on the latest regulations and safe systems of work, including ACoP (Approved Code of Practice).

If you are unfamiliar with wood machines, they can be daunting. This course focuses on the accurate and efficient use of modern woodworking machines operated within craft workshops. Students are introduced to a variety of wood machines, mainly from the Felder "Hammer" range that all comply with the latest legislation.

Peter teaches the course himself and small groups ensure everyone benefits from practical demonstrations and hands-on tuition. Peter Sefton has been using wood machines for many years and is highly experienced in teaching students will all levels of experience. You can choose to take the course over two or three days; the final day of the course is dedicated solely to the setting up and safe use of the spindle moulder, to include the selection of cutter blocks and suitable guarding techniques.

Peter is on hand throughout the course to offer advice with any problems students may be having, as well as guidance on buying machines and tooling. Students are also able to try out, test and buy woodworking tools and equipment from Peter's tool shop www.woodworkersworkshop.co.uk with a 5% discount – try before you buy

- **What will I achieve?**

This course will give you a thorough grounding in the safe and practical use of wood machines and tool selection – ensuring students have the skills needed to make the most the most of their investment in wood machines. Students learn how to save time, work accurately and with confidence. On completion of the course students are given an extensive manual, written by Peter, on the Safe Use of Woodworking Machines and Setting up of Guards.

Course Content

 - Safe systems of work and ACoP in the working environment

 - Narrow Band Saw
 - Dimension/Panel Saw
 - Surface Planer/Thicknesser
 - Hollow Chisel Mortiser
 - Spindle Moulder and Power Feed (Day 3 only)
- **Machining Procedures**
 - Setting up
 - Blade selection and changing
 - Fault diagnosis and rectification
 - Cutter block selection and spindle speed setting (Day 3 only)
- **Machining Techniques**
 - Ripping, deeping, cross cutting
 - Band Saw free hand curved work and template curved work
 - Straight line edging, manufactured board sizing
 - Mitring, compound angles
 - Cutting laminates, inlays and small mouldings
 - Face side and face edge, edging manufactured boards
 - Machine mortising
 - Straight fence and curved work (Day 3 only)
 - Shaw Guard setting and power feeding (Day 3 only)
